### **Highest precision** and safe cutting of a variety of fabrics

The dressmaking shears Xact "Professional" from KAI with micro serration are a must when you need to cut silk or synthetic fibres. The special additional serration consistently prevents difficult fabrics from slipping.

The precision forged blades are made from rust-proof stainless steel and mounted in such a balanced way that the scissor blades of the dressmaking scissors meet at only one point, which prevents the fabric from slipping.

Furthermore, the dressmaking shears impress with their soft handle, which allow for pleasant and fatigue-free work. The larger eye offers room for several fingers, so that you need very little force in cutting.

# VARIO PLIERS FOR PRESS FASTENERS, EYELETS AND PIERCING

# The universal tool for many Prym non-sew articles



The processing tools are not an integral part of the VARIO pliers but can be found in the appropriate eyelets and press fasteners packs. With the adapter, which is also available, the VARIO pliers are also suitable for 'Color Snaps'.

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### TRIPOD TOOL FOR NON-SEW PRESS FASTENERS

# Unbeatably precise - even a long way from the edge of the fabric

The tripod from Prym is a practical utensil for attaching non-sew press fasteners and eyelets in places a long way from the edge of the fabric. With its three legs standing stable in the plate, the tripod can be used to attach rivets, eyelets, jeans buttons and press fasteners precisely at any point on the fabric.

The plate of the tripod is pushed under the material - the upper part of the tripod is set on top of the material. The tools from the respective pack have to be pushed into the plate and into the upper part. The press fastener is riveted with a hammer, ideally made out of rubber.

Due to its ergonomic design, this useful riveting tool has even received the well known Red Dot Design Award. The tripod can be used for all non-sew press fasteners and eyelets, with the exception of 'Color Snaps' and 11 mm and 14 mm eyelets!

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

# PARALLEL TRACING WHEEL "MULTI"

# Marking and tracing in one operation



The ingenious tool comprises a mouse chalk wheel for marking the seam lines and a parallel device with a spacer, which transfers onto the fabric the required seam allowance of 15 mm, 25 mm and 40 mm exactly parallel to the pattern.

The parallel tracing wheel "Multi" convinces with its ergonomic design and its good feel, the finely measured washable chalk line, with chalk refills in white and yellow and the practical viewing window for the level of chalk.

# Freehand tracing and marking on all fabrics

The chalk wheel "mouse" from the prym.ergonomics range is ideal for freehand tracing and marking on all fabrics. The fine teeth at the top of the mouse-shaped chalk wheel leave a clearly visible fine chalk line, which can be removed easily after sewing by brushing or washing the fabric.

The pleasant-to-hold ergonomic housing of the chalk mouse ensures fatigue-free work. A handy cap reliably seals the chalk wheel and the level of chalk in the cartridge can always be seen through a window. It is no coincidence that this practical chalk wheel won the Red Dot Design Award in 2010.

### UNIVERSAL RULER OMNIGRID + RULER HANDLE

# An all-purpose ruler. The perfect complement – the new ruler handle!

Whether on the cutting table or the sewing machine: the Omnigrid universal rulers from Prym are indispensable companions for patchwork, dressmaking and tailoring or for graphic work.

The yellow and black grid markings in a metric or inch scale make it possible to mark accurately on both dark and light fabrics. The scratch-resistant laser print on the underside of the ruler prevents visual distortion. Thick, resistant, durable material guarantees safe guiding of rotary cutters and art knives on the cutting mat. Some versions of the Omnigrid rulers also have 30, 45 and 60 degree angle markings for cutting out triangles, diamonds and strips on the bias. To keep things tidy, it can be hung up by its suspension hole.

The practical ruler handle makes it easier to lift, place and stabilise the ruler.

#### Searching for a needle in a haystack? Not with the needle twister

# Make your own perfect bias binding tapes

The practical tape maker from Prym allows you to make any length of bias binding to bind all fabric edges and also patchwork quilts. Because the fabric strips are cut at an angle of 45 degrees to the straight grain of the fabric, the bias binding tape is elastic and can be attached around curves to absolute perfection. Once the fabric strips have been cut out and linked together, the fabric is fed into the wide opening of the bias binding maker and pulled through it. On the flat side of the useful aid immaculate folded strips of bias binding are drawn out and can be immediately smoothed with the iron. This is a quick, reliable way to make bias binding tape, which can simply be rolled up for later use.

Is it easy to make your own pompoms? No problem. The pompom maker 2 in 1 from Prym provides the right tool to make cheerfully colourful pompoms. It's simply child's play to transform a large number of handicraft and needlework ideas with a little wool and a pair of scissors.

The pack contains one tool with 2 sets of templates in 2 different sizes, to make pompoms with a diameter of 3.5 cm and 5 cm or 7 cm and 9 cm (Article No.: 624 182). The detailed instructions enclosed explain exactly how to wind thick, professional pompoms.

This requires only one process and there you are with either 6 or 8 mini pompoms at the same time, each 3 cm or 2 cm in diameter. The tool has the appropriate markings and comes with step-by-step instructions to make the task really easy.

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# CROCHET HOOK FOR WOOL

#### The ergonomic range from Prym – new dimensions in crochet

The colourful prym.ergonomics crochet hooks for wool are manufactured from special high-quality synthetic material.

They ensure that you can work easily, without strain on the wrists, and are comfortably warm to the touch. The high-gloss polished shaft allows the stitches to glide easily, while the ergonomic shape of the slip-resistant plastic handle ensures that you enjoy pleasant, effortless crochet.

When launched in 2014 the prym.ergonomics wool crochet hooks won the Red Dot Design Award.

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### POLAR BEAR 1

Cool vibes in the child's bedroom



Creative material: dressmaking scissors Xact "Professional", parallel tracing wheel "Multi", thimble "Soft Comfort", polyester wadding, trick marker, corner and edge shaper, iron, creative interfacing, dressmaker's pattern paper, dressmaking pins, 30 cm fabric each in blue, black, pink, white, matching thread

Extra tip: Choose a slightly thicker, opaque white fabric for the polar bear's head.



Trace the cutting-out pattern for the cushion on pages 22 - 23 onto the dressmaker's pattern paper and cut it out.



Set the spacer for the seam allowance on the tracing wheel to the lowest level (1.5 cm).

Available in hook gauges from 3.00 mm to 15.00 mm. The handles in various fresh colours help you to identify the required gauge so that the crochet hook can be quickly retrieved from your work basket.



Place the pattern for the body of the cushion on the fold of the fabric and mark a seam allowance of 1.5 cm around it.



Cut out the body of the cushion. Repeat steps 4 - 5 with the second side of the cushion body.



Iron the templates on the cushion front. If you wish, you can apply the templates with a narrow zig-zag stitch or a straight stitch, if you are proficient in doing this.




Place the cushion front on the cushion back and pin the two sections together.



Trace all the sections marked with a red dot for the bear's head on pages 22 - 23 as often as indicated onto the creative interfacing and cut out.



Iron the template with the laminated sides onto the respective fabrics in the colours indicated and cut out the templates together with the fabric.



Sew the cushion together around the edges with a 1.5 cm seam allowance. Leave an opening for turning of about 10 cm in width.



Turn the cushion right side out, shape the curves neatly with the edge shaper and iron the cushion into shape. Iron the seam allowance for the turning opening inwards.



Place the front section of the cushion in front of you. Peel off the backing paper on the template for the polar bear motif.




Place the template with the fleecy side face down, like the polar bear motif on page 23, on the front of the cushion. When doing this, slide the ears slightly beneath the bear's head.



Fill the cushion with the wadding until you have the volume you require.



Close the turning opening by hand, for example with invisible ladder stitch.







Creative material: As for POLAR BEAR 1, but fabrics only in blue and white. In addition, you need a prym.ergonomics crochet hook for wool in gauge 4 and black and pink wool.



Cut out the body of the cushion. For this, follow the instructions for Steps 2 - 5 for POLAR BEAR 1.



Trace the polar bear's head and ears on the outside of the creative interfacing. Follow the instructions for Steps 6 - 7 for POLAR BEAR 1.



Secure the fabrics as in Step 9 for POLAR BEAR 1 to the front of the cushion.



Crochet the round parts of the face. Round 1: Crochet 4 single crochet to form a ring (4 single crochet). Round 2: Crochet 2 single crochet in each stitch (8 single crochet).



Nose, snout and inside of the polar bear's ears: Pick up chain stitches following the pattern. Continue working with single crochet and decrease and increase at the beginning and end of the rows, as instructed in the pattern.



Pin the nose onto the snout, shape the corners of the mouth into a smile. Hide the threads beneath the nose and sew the nose onto the snout.



Place all the crochet sections on the polar bear's head as shown on page 23 of the template. Sew the face sections onto the polar bear's head.



Place the cushion front on the cushion back and pin the two sections together. Sew around the edges of the cushion as shown in step 12 on page 21.




Turn the cushion right side out and iron into shape, then fill it with the wadding and close it as shown in steps 14 - 15 on page 21.






Creative material: cutting mat, rotary cutter Maxi Easy, Universal ruler Omnigrid, ruler handle, dressmaker's pattern paper, trick marker, tripod, press fasteners for anorak in copper, hammer, polyester wadding, 0,5 m fabric in 5 colours of your choice, matching thread



For the front of the cushion draw a 43 cm x 43 cm rectangle on paper and for the back draw a 30 cm x 43 cm rectangle.



Divide the pattern for the front into 5 rectangles to the desired layout and cut them out.



Pin the 5 cut pieces on the selected 5 fabrics and trace a seam allowance of 1.5 cm all around.



Now use the rotary cutter and the Universal ruler to cut the fabrics along the traced line.



Pin the cut-out fabric pieces for the front one after the other and then sew them together.



Cut out two pieces for the back. Fold each of the short sides of the cushion back and front 3 cm twice towards the wrong side, iron and pin securely. Stitch these hems to a width of 2.5 cm.



Pin the back sections together wrong side to right side: the seams should overlap, the edges should be flush with the edges of the front section. Mark the position of the snap fasteners on the hems.



Using the tripod tool and a hammer, insert the snap fasteners into the cushion hem.



Pin the front and back sections of the cushion together right side to right side, sew the side seams (seam allowance 1.5 cm) and turn the cushion right side out. Stuff it with the polyester wadding.





Creative material: creative fabric, pompom maker 2 in 1, mini pompon maker, dressmaking scissors Xact "Professional", trick marker, polyester wadding, iron, pins, textile spray adhesive, 1 ball green wool, 2 balls yellow wool, motif of your choice (lemon motif), 0,5 m fabric, matching thread



From the fabric cut out two squares, each 43 cm x 43 cm and press the motif onto the creative fabric.



Cut the motif out of the creative fabric, remove the backing paper and spray the motif with the textile spray adhesive.



Iron the lemon motif securely to the centre of the front of the cushion.



Wind the yellow wool around the pompom maker 2 in 1 and make 20 to 25 yellow pompoms.



Wind the green wool around the mini pompom maker and make 20 to 23 green pompoms.



Trim the pompoms into shape.



Sew the pompoms on to the motif, making sure that they are really close to one another. Start at the outer edges and then work inwards.



Trim all the pompoms into shape once more, so that the lemon motif is clearly recognisable. Then sew the back of the cushion to the front (seam allowance 1.5 cm), leaving the lower edge open.



Iron 1.5 cm of the lower edge towards the inside. Stuff the cushion with the polyester wadding and machine-sew or hand-sew the lower opening close to the edge.





Creative material: creative fabric, mini pompom maker. dressmaking scissors Xact "Professional", trick marker, tape maker, spring tape measure, VARIO pliers, 'Color Snaps' red, polyester wadding, iron, dressmaking pins, textile spray adhesive, 1 ball red wool, letters of your choice, 0,5 m pink and red fabric, matching thread



Cut out the cushion sections as in step 2 on page 26. Press the letters onto the creative fabric and secure them to the cushion as in steps 2 - 4 on pages 28/29.



Wind your wool around the mini pompom maker and make about 50 to 60 pompoms.



Hand-sew all the pompoms close together to the letters.



Trim the pompoms into shape, so that the letters are clearly recognisable.



Sew the back (7 - 8, page 27) and use the VARIO pliers to attach the 5 'Color Snaps'. Sew the cushion together **wrong side to wrong side** (seam allowance 1.5 cm). Next, trim the seam allowance to 0.5 cm.



Cut 4 fabric strips, each 3.6 cm x 46 cm, at a 45° angle to the straight grain of the fabric.



Sew the ends of the strips together, draw the tape through the tape maker and iron it into shape (see product instructions).



Pin the bias binding tape to the back. Curve the bias binding slightly round the corners. Sew along the first ironed fold. Fold the bias binding to the front, iron and sew it again from this side.



Stuff the cushion with polyester wadding and sew one pompom to each corner of the cushion.
